NOW COMES, the County of Madison, hereinafter referred to as the County and Mobile Rehab, LLC, hereinafter referred to as Provider, and hereby contract and agree as follows:

- 1. The purpose of this memorandum is to provide for rehabilitation services at the Marshall Senior Center.
- 2. The Provider will participate as requested, and the availability of therapists allows, in the Agency's wellness programs as a consultant and physical therapy services provider. This may include, but is not limited to, giving presentations or teaching appropriate exercise classes at a reduced or waived cost to the Agency or its clients and expanding the Agency staff's knowledge of physical therapy.
- 3. The Agency will make suitable space available for the Provider to serve Agency members and private clients. The Provider has arrangements with local healthcare professionals and may from time to time receive referrals from them. The Provider will have the opportunity to schedule appointments for physical therapy with those referred patients.
- 4. In addition, during the normal course of assisting in Wellness programming, the Provider may identify clients for whom physical therapy would, in the Provider's professional opinion, be beneficial. The Providers may discuss the benefits of therapy with the client and contact the client's appropriate healthcare professional, with the consent of the client [or guardian], to ensure physician approval of services.
- 5. The Provider will have access to the Agency's facilities for private physical therapy sessions during normal business hours, based upon availability. The Provider will also have access to the Fitness Area equipment for use with physical therapy patients during scheduled treatment times only, without requiring an additional fee for use of the equipment during the scheduled treatment time. Paying Senior Center members shall be given preference to use all gym equipment and consideration will be made to avoid use of the Fitness Area for therapy if the space is overly busy or would cause paying members to have to wait for machines.
- 6. The Provider is responsible for maintaining all appropriate insurance and licenses for the services provided, and will assist all clients in filing insurance claims for services provided.
- 7. The burden of documentation and record keeping is with the Provider. All documentation and billing will be completed by the Provider.
- 8. The Agency will promote the relationship between the Agency and the Provider consistent with the mission and requirements of the Agency.
  - 9. The Agency will maintain the facilities for ongoing use by the Provider.

- 10. The Provider will maintain all appropriate licenses and insurance for physical therapy, and will provide appropriate copies to the Agency upon request. The Provider will provide proof of Liability Insurance and list Marshall Senior Center as "additionally insured". A certificate of insurance will be updated annually along with the Memorandum of Understanding.
- 11. This agreement may be terminated without cause or prejudice by either party upon two weeks prior written notice of termination. Upon termination, all parts of the agreement are null.




