MINUTES

COUNTY OF MADISON

The Madison County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, October 8, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. in the Courtroom, Madison County Courthouse, Marshall, NC.

In attendance were Chair Debbie Ponder, Commissioner Hall Moore, Commissioner Bill Briggs, Commissioner Sue Vilcinskas, and Attorney Larry Leake. Commissioner Billy Roberts was absent due to vacation.

I.

Upon motion from Commissioner Moore, seconded by Commissioner Vilcinskas, the Board voted unanimously to approve the agenda as presented with the following addition: Karen Kiehna - Public Hearings.

II.

Upon motion from Commissioner Moore, seconded by Commissioner Vilcinskas, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the September 10, 2012 meeting with the following resolution being added to those minutes:

Upon motion of Chair Ponder, seconded by Commissioner Roberts, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION

COUNTY OF MADISON

WHEREAS, texting while driving constitutes an extreme safety hazard not only for the driver of the vehicle in question, but for the rest of the traveling public; and

WHEREAS, County employees regularly operate County owned vehicles;

WHEREFORE, for the protection of County employees, and the traveling public, the Madison County Personnel Policy is hereby amended to provide that texting while driving creates an extreme safety hazard and doing so while driving a County owned vehicle shall result in termination.

III.

Karen Kiehna appeared before the Board to conduct the second public hearing for the Long Ridge/Rosenwald Catalyst Project.

Questions were received from Bill Briggs and Wayne Brigman. Willa Wyatt commented on the project.

Upon motion by Commissioner Moore, seconded by Commissioner Vilcinskas, the Board voted unanimously to continue with this grant application.

IV.

A general public hearing was also held for all CDBG applications, conducted by Karen Kiehna. This was the first Public Hearing and is required for the County to pursue CDBG funding to address housing rehabilitation, infrastructure, small business and entrepreneurial, capacity and/or catalyst projects. The purpose of the public hearing was to receive citizen input as to the needs of low to moderate income residents and neighborhoods within the County.

Questions were received from Bill Briggs.

Upon motion by Commissioner Moore, seconded by Commissioner Vilcinskas, the Board voted unanimously to move forward with these grants.

V.

Upon recommendation of Commissioner Vilcinskas, and upon motion by Commissioner Moore, seconded by Commissioner Briggs, the Board voted unanimously to reconstitute the Economic Development Board as the Madison County Strategic Tourism and Economic Development Board and to charge that Board with the responsibility of developing goals and strategies to further tourism and economic development in the County.

VI.

Upon recommendation of Sallie Klipp, Library Director, and upon motion by Commissioner Moore, seconded by Commissioner Vilcinskas, the Board voted unanimously to move Melissa Salazar from a part-time position to a full-time position to replace Ann Parks, who has retired.

VII.

On behalf of Jeff Willis, Emergency Management Director, Attorney Leake presented a grant which the County has been approved for, along with Buncombe, and the municipalities in both counties, for a Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Upon motion by Commissioner Moore, seconded by Commissioner Vilcinskas, the Board voted unanimously to approve Madison County becoming the lead agency and for the Buncombe and Madison Emergency Management coordinators to jointly agree upon a consultant/company to do the work on creating the multi-jurisdictional plan.

The regional plan should be completed and approved by December, 2014. The Emergency Management Directors shall present to the Board of Commissioners their recommendation as to the consultant/company which should be employed to create the Plan.

VIII.

Upon recommendation from Sandy Stevenson, and upon motion by Commissioner Vilcinskas, seconded by Commissioner Moore, the Board voted unanimously to authorize the Chair to sign a letter of support from the Board for a grant application to the Blue Ridge National Heritage Association with regards to the Appalachian Barn Alliance.

IX.

Gary Webb, Triple P Coordinator with the Health Department, made a presentation to the Board concerning the Triple P Program.

X.

Upon motion by Commissioner Moore, seconded by Commissioner Vilcinskis, the Board voted unanimously to approve a resolution with regard to funding in the amount of \$700.00 held by the Community Foundation of Western North Carolina which would be used for the purchasing of various fencing to enhance the appearance of Barnard Park.

XI.

The Western Highlands fourth quarter report was received by the Board.

XII.

Upon request from Jan Shepard, Health Director, and upon motion by Commissioner Moore, seconded by Commissioner Vilcinskis, the Board granted permission to Mrs. Shepard to advertise for a replacement of the current dentist, Dr. Steve McHatton, whose resignation is effective November 1, 2012.

XIII.

The County Transportation Authority does not have sufficient resources to transport all of the Department of Social Services' clients to their health care appointments.

Upon recommendation from Connie Harris, Social Services Director, presented by Attorney Leake, and upon motion from Commissioner Moore, seconded by Commissioner Vilcinskis, the Board voted unanimously to approve the contract below.

CONTRACT

COUNTY OF MADISON

Stacie's Personal Care Services, Inc.; hereinafter referred to as Stacie's to provide certain services to and for the Madison County Department of Social Services, pursuant to the following terms and conditions:

WITNESSETH

1. The Department of Social Services is in need of providing transportation for its clients who are covered by Medicaid to and from various medical appointments.
2. The Department does not currently have adequate transportation to meet all such needs.
3. Stacie's is willing to assist with the meeting of those needs, and understands that its services will not be called upon, unless the Department itself, or the Madison County Transportation Authority cannot meet the needs of the clients.
4. Stacie's is willing to transport clients as needed, at a cost of \$2.25 per mile, said mileage to only be charged for time when the client is actually in the vehicle.
5. Stacie's hereby guarantees and contracts as follows:
 - a. That it is familiar with the requirements as specified in pages 30-33 of MA-2910/3550, and that it will fully comply with all such regulations.

b. That it will not miss more than one-quarter of one percent of all trips offered to it during the course of the contract year, and that it will be on-time such that no more than 5% of the clients would arrive late for their scheduled appointments during a given month.

c. Will provide names of all owners, managers, management entities, and subcontractors.

d. Will provide insurance information and will report any changes in such insurance, and will advise the County should there be any change in its ownership or management, or any issues which might prevent it from participating in the Medicare program.

e. That it will monitor all records to ensure that all contract requirements are met, and acknowledges that it has an obligation to report all no-shows on a daily basis and cancellations on a monthly basis.

f. It will record all recipient complaints which deal with the vendor, including date of the complaint, the nature of the complaint and what steps were or are being taken to resolve the complaint.

g. It will provide to the Department the appropriate transportation billing codes on invoices so that the County may seek reimbursement from Medicaid for payments made by the County to it, and acknowledges that in the near future, it will bill Medicaid directly for said charges.

h. It will provide insurance sufficient to meet the minimum coverage required by the North Carolina Utilities Commission for common carrier-passenger vehicles, and that all vehicles will be operated by licensed individuals, of at least 18 years of age, with all drivers being subject to alcohol and drug testing and all vehicles being subject to State inspection.

i. It will provide to the County a copy of the driving records of all of its employees who will be providing requisite transportation services.

6: Stacie's acknowledges that it is familiar with those requirements with regard to ownership and control contained in 42 CFR 455.104 and those relative to business transactions contained in 42 CFR 455.105.

7. Employees of Stacie's who participate in the transportation program shall be required to participate in random alcohol and drug testing programs which meet the requirements of the Federal Transit Authority.

8. The County agrees that it will compensate Stacie's at the rate of \$2.25 per passenger mile, and should the price for regular gasoline increase to \$4.00 or more, that Stacie's would receive the sum of \$2.35 per mile.

9. The contract would be terminable at will by either party upon the giving of a written 30 days notice.
