#### LEASE AGREEMENT

NOW COMES the County of Madison, hereinafter referred to as "County", and George Arrington and Wife, Ann Marie Arrington, hereinafter referred to as "Lessor", and hereby contract and agree as follows:

 Pursuant to prior leases, the County of Madison leased certain property more particularly described as follows:

That parcel of land located approximately 100 yards West of Big Laurel Baptist Church on State Road No. 1318, also known as Big Laurel Road, consisting of a parcel approximately 180 feet along said road, and approximately 75 feet deep.

This parcel is a portion of the property described in Deed Book 184 at Page 418 and Deed Book 131 at Page 633 in the aforesaid Registry (being the references of the property into the former Lessors, the Rices as described in the aforesaid Lease Agreement of 1996) and a portion of the property now owned by the herein Lessor by virtue of the aforesaid deeds recorded in Deed Book 243 at Page 630 and Deed Book 244 at Page 602 in the aforesaid Registry.

- The County's lease of said property expired on June 30,
- The parties are desirous of renewing said rental arrangement for another five years, to and through June 30, 2016.
- 4. The County shall pay the sum of \$3,000.00 on or before January 1 of each year, beginning January 1, 2012 until January 1, 2016, at which time the payment should be \$1,500.00.
- The Lessor shall be responsible for the payment of all property taxes due on said premises.

- 6. The County shall have the right to make improvements on said premises in keeping with the purpose for which the premises are leased, and the County shall have the right to remove all improvements not attached to the realty at the end of the term of this lease Agreement or at the time of the termination of same if terminated early as provided herein.
- 7. The County shall be responsible for maintaining and keeping free from trash and garbage an area of one hundred feet in each direction around the demised premises during the term of this Lease Agreement.
- 8. This lease Agreement replaces and modifies previous Lease Agreements between the County and the Lessors.
- This Lease Agreement shall be binding on the parties, their heirs, successors, and assigns in interest.

#### MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

# MADISON COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES and WESTERN HIGHLANDS AREA AUTHORITY and RHA HEALTH SERVICES, INC.

This Memorandum of Agreement is entered into and by the County of Madison, providing for the County through its Department of Social Services, hereinafter referred to as the "the Department" to utilize the services of Western Highlands Area Authority, hereinafter referred to as the "Authority", and RHA Health Services, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "Provider".

In 1997 the North Carolina General Assembly enacted *General Statute 108A-29.1*, *Substance Abuse Treatment Required: Drug Tasting for Work First Program Recipients* and *General Statute 108A-25, Exemption from limitations for individuals convicted of certain drug-related felonies.* These two laws are the basis for the current North Carolina Work First/Child Protective Services (CPS) Substance Abuse Initiative. The initiative is intended to provide early identification of individuals applying for public assistance who may be experiencing substance use problems that act as a barrier to self-sufficiency. Furthermore, the Identification assists in connecting the individuals to substance abuse treatment, so that sustained self-sufficiency is likely and benefits the family.

In 2001, the Work First/CPS Substance Abuse Initiative was expanded in two ways. The first allows for voluntary mental health screenings of the Work First applicants and subsequent connection to mental health treatment if indicated. The second expansion allows for Work First/CPS Substance Abuse Initiative services to the families whose CPS cases have been substantiated or found in need of services with an indication of substance abuse. The expansion to include a population who may experience mental health issues as barriers to self sufficiency and a population whose possible addiction is jeopardizing their family, results in more individuals and families receiving necessary treatment for recovery.

The North Carolina Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities and Substance Abuse Services (DMH/DD/SAS) holds a Memorandum of Agreement with the North Carolina Division of Social Services (DSS) for the joint management of this initiative. Included in the joint responsibilities is reciprocal training and technical assistance regarding DSS programs and substance abuse.

The following populations are included in this Initiative:

- Work First Program applicants and recipients
- Class H or I Controlled Substance Felons convicted under federal and State law after August 22, 1996 applying for Work First assistance and/or food stamps
- Non-custodial parents and/or families with income at or below 200% of federal poverty guidelines
- Parent(s)/Caretakers who have a substantiated or in need of services finding that involved substance abuse

## I. THE DEPARTMENT AGREES TO:

- Explain to the parent/caretaker the nature of the Work First/Child Protective Services
   (WF/CPS) Substance Abuse Initiative including the assessment and the services provided by
  the Provider.
- 8. Secure appropriate signature(s) on the approved Release of Confidential Information Form when the parent/caretaker consents to the referral. Explain the type of information to be disclosed and ensure that the parent/caretaker initials each category of information s/he is willing to have the Provider disclose.
- C. Administer the Alcohol Use Disorder Identification Test (AUDIT) and the Drug Abuse Screening Test (DAST-10) to all Work First Program specific applicants. If neither the AUDIT or DAST-10 reveal a substance abuse issue, the Behavioral Health Indicator Checklist will be completed based on the observation of the DSS worker. If an applicant agrees to a voluntary mental health screening, the Emotional Health Inventory will be utilized by the DSS Work First staff.
- D. Refer (accompanied by the Release of Confidential Information Form) the following individuals to the Work First Substance Abuse Provider: 1) Work First clients who hit the threshold for a substance abuse or mental health issue on either of the three instruments listed in "C" above, 2) All food stamp applicants or Work First Program participants who have been convicted under federal or state law of a H or I controlled substance felony after August 22, 1996, 3) Parent(s)/Caretakers who have a substantiated or in need of services finding that involved substance abuse

Protected Health Information (PHI) will be done in accordance with the terms of the Business Associate Agreement duly executed by all parties.

The Business Associate Agreement between AUTHORITY and DEPARTMENT is Attachment A of this Agreement.

The Business Associate Agreement between AUTHORITY and PROVIDER is Attachment B of the current *Purchase of Services Agreement* between Western Highland Authority and Provider. C,

## VII. TERMS OF AGREEMENT:

This Agreement shall be in effect as of July 1, 2012, and unless earlier terminated, shall terminate June 30, 2013.

This Agreement may be amended or terminated upon mutual agreement of both parties, or terminated by any party within thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other parties.
